The Equine Assisted Psychotherapy and Learning (EAP/EAL) program has really taken off and we are looking forward to a busy spring. In addition to our ongoing individual sessions that take place each week, we are excited to offer three events to the community that will take place in the upcoming months. Our third NW AHEC sponsored workshop for professionals, "The Power of Working with Horses for Health and Personal Growth: An Introductory Workshop on Equine Assisted Therapies for Professionals in Health Care

### Riverwood to Host NARHA Workshop and Certification

Have you ever thought about becoming a Riverwood instructor? Each of our teachers is a certified therapeutic riding instructor or instructor-in-training. We expect the best of our students, and we also expect the very best from our instructors! June 16 – 19, Riverwood will host a North American Riding for the Handicapped Association (NARHA) onsite workshop and certification course. This course will welcome instructors and instructors-in-training from across the country and will be lead by Mary Jo Beckman, NARHA Master Therapeutic Riding instructor, NARHA certified driving instructor, Registered level on-site workshop/certified faculty/evaluator Lead Accreditation visitor; and Pebbles Turbeville, NARHA Advance Therapeutic Riding instructor, NARHA Mentor Instructor, Registered level on-site workshop/certified faculty/evaluator Lead.

For anyone who would like to become a certified instructor, this is only one step in the process! Applicants must successfully complete the following to attain national certification:

- Apply for NARHA membership.
- Submit NARHA instructor certification application to the NARHA office.
- Complete two online courses and exams.
- Complete a Horsemanship Skills Checklist.
- Obtain current CPR and First Aid certification (online not accepted).
- Complete 25 hours teaching group lessons (two or more riders) with disabilities under the guidance or direct supervision of a NARHA Certified Instructor
- Attend and successfully complete an on-site workshop which includes two-and-a-half days of both classroom and hands-on learning.
- Attend and successfully complete an on-site certification in which candidates can complete their certification by demonstrating their riding ability and instruction to a class of at least two students with disabilities.

This May marks the 13<sup>th</sup> year that Riverwood will be hosting a spring horse show at the farm. We are excited to announce that we will be having some "outside" competitors from Bright Star Stables near Raleigh coming to join our riders. Many of our riders are busy preparing so they can give a great performance, and we'd love for all of our Riverwood fans to come to cheer on our riders!

## Volunteers Needed

Riverwood is always in need of leaders and sidewalkers to assist with both our therapeutic riding classes and Hippotherapy sessions. We are currently recruiting volunteers for our spring and summer sessions. No horse experience is necessary as we will provide all of the training needed. Please consider spending an hour or two a week with us and "experience the success".

We are now offering a once-a-month volunteer orientation on Saturdays. The initial training is a three hour period in which we teach volunteers about our policies, safety standards and how to be an effective and safe side walker for our riders. There is also an additional hour which teaches specifically how to be safe and effective with the horses so that folks can be trained as leaders for the classes. If you do not wish to lead the horses, you do not have to attend the final hour of the class.

We have encouraged all of our existing volunteers to attend the new format classes and have had an overwhelming response! New volunteers to Riverwood also attend these classes and are well prepared to help our riders.
