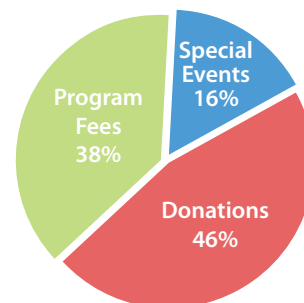

In 2011, the cost to operate the facility for 1 day = \$637

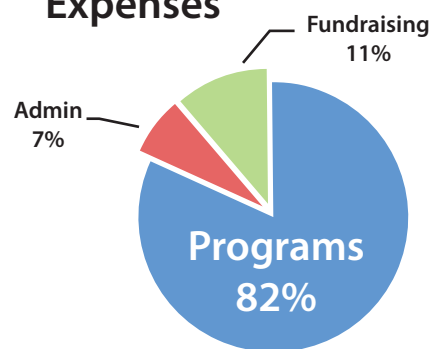
**82 cents of every dollar was spent on therapeutic riding programs**

Riverwood served an average of 90 students per week. Riverwood subsidizes approximately 70% of the cost of riding lessons for all participants; beyond that, Riverwood gave \$2,307 in scholarships to those who could not afford the fees.

In 2011, Riverwood expanded the Equine Assisted Psychotherapy and Equine Assisted Learning programs.
